Country-Report Ruanda

- 1. What is life like as a miner's wife in your country?
- *ANSWER: We don't have many comforts of life or much happiness like the local miners because of the low income and financial support, materials, but for sure we have many comforts and efforts.
- 2. Do your children go to school or work in the mines?
- *ANSWER: Our children should go to school, not in the mine, but because of the low income or financial ability, unable to support 6 children in school, I as a parent decided to send 3 children to school for one year, and the other 3 children I go to the mine with them to help me pay the school fees for their siblings; but if we had a good income or financial support, all the children could attend school on time and in good condition.
- 3. Do you live in the mining company's house or somewhere else?
- *ANSWER: As a local miner, I don't have a company because it is very hard to afford a company without financial support and you need registration and other financial support, so I always camp near my local mining site where I make my bricks and break the local bricks in our community so I can live somewhere else.
- 4. How are the women provided for when the husband can no longer work or is dead? *ANSWER: Any woman who has lived such a bitter life must not think negatively and undermine herself: She must trust herself because she is a hard-working woman, because all the bills are on her responsibility, including the school fees for her children; she must be very smart, very perceptive and very active everywhere she has ever played a role of << I CAN DO IT>>, and promote her efforts and her energy, her personality and always be firm in what she does, trust herself. Because a woman can do what a man can do.
- 5. How do the miners' wives organize themselves and how do they stick together?
- * ANSWER: They must be free and open in their communication, work as a team and be a family, respect their traditional roles, work well together and have good knowledge to make themselves a good leader and develop in their mining system. Example: create a financial cooperative (SACO) that can help someone in urgent cases.
- Stay united and mutual, work as a team, support each other specially, physically and financially.
